

University of Brasilia

- ☐ The University of Brasilia (UnB) was created in 1962 following the joint vision of the anthropologist Darcy Ribeiro and the educator Anísio Teixeira.
- ☐ Its conception came from the same revolutionary spirit that gave rise to the federal capital, Brasilia: to renew the methods of learning and to teach towards the future.
- Dedicated to the promotion of free, inclusive and high-quality education, UnB is among the best universities in Brazil.
- ☐ Its institutional mission is to produce, integrate and disseminate knowledge, and to educate citizens to be committed to ethics, social responsibility and sustainable development.
- ☐ In 1995, the Serial Evaluation Program (PAS) was created, the first form of university entrance evaluation in three stages with exams held in each high school year.
- ☐ In 2003, UnB was the first Brazilian federal university to approve affirmative action for black and indigenous applicants.





Teaching

- ☐ At the University of Brasilia, teaching is inseparable from research and extension.
- ☐ At the undergraduate and graduate levels, students can carry out scientific experiments and transform knowledge into social benefits.
- Multidisciplinarity is a prominent feature of the University.
- ☐ In addition to attending compulsory courses, students can complement their education by attending courses in other departments and areas of interest.
- ☐ Lectures, academic conferences, presentations and workshops happen daily on the campuses.

Research

- □ 320 laboratories and more than 500 research groups focus their efforts on finding new paths to solving different problems.
- ☐ At the undergraduate level, students are initiated into scientific research in three major areas: Exact Sciences and Technology, Arts and Humanities, and Health and Life.

Inclusion

- ☐ UnB values diversity, forming a more pluralistic and egalitarian academic community.
- Currently, 50% of the vacancies in the main selection processes are destined, by law, to students of public schools. At the discretion of UnB, more than 5% of the opportunities are reserved for Afro-Brazilian students.
- Institutional policies and programs also promote equity in higher education.
- People with disabilities have personalized support in the classroom and for their daily academic activities.
- There are special places and actions that exist to guide and welcome students in order to combat intolerance, to promote educational reflection and to strengthen cultural and political minority groups.
- For students in a situation of social vulnerability, UnB offers financial assistance; student lodging; free food at the University Restaurant; book vouchers and scholarships for foreign languages courses.

Extension

- ☐ UnB develops more than 300 extension projects.
- ☐ Professors, staff and students work in areas such as health, human rights and justice, environment, technology, agricultural sciences, education, communication and culture.
- ☐ There is constant dialogue between the knowledge acquired in classrooms and laboratories and the knowledge of citizenship, solidified by practice.
- ☐ UnB develops projects in order to promote social and regional integration.
- ☐ The Latin America Culture House preserves the cultural heritage of UnB and promotes dialogue with neighboring countries.

- □ From 2012 to 2017, UnB received 749 foreign students, and sent 943 exchange students to universities all over the world.
- ☐ There are more than 270 agreements with foreign institutions, in 47 countries, which allow undergraduate and graduate students to supplement their studies through exchanges.
- These agreements also enable the cooperation between UnB and foreign professors and researchers, the exchange of research, the formation of knowledge networks and international publications.
